
INDIAN STAR 8" Two blocks


Color 1 dark peach – one 2-1/2" x 20 " strip

Color 2 light peach – one 2-1/2" x 15" strip


Color 3 white - one 2-1/2" x 5" strip AND one 5" x 9" strip



Cut the Color 1 2-1/2" x 20 " strip into eight 2-1/2" squares. Cut the Color 2 2-1/2" x 15" strip into six 2-1/2" squares. Cut the Color 3 2-1/2" x 5" strip into two 2-1/2" squares. Cut the Color 3 5" x 9" strip into four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles...



Using two Color 2 and two Color 3 2-1/2" squares, sew the four patch unit shown at left. Use all 1/4" seams and press the seams to the darker side. This unit should measure 4-1/2"...



Now, to make one flying geese unit, place a Color 1 small square right sides together at one end of a Color 3 rectangle, with outer edges aligned. (I show them staggered here just so you can see what pieces I mean. On the back of the top square lightly mark the diagonal. Sew ON this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the center. Repeat this with another Color 1 square on the other end of the rectangle. Make a total of four geese in the same manner. They should measure 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"...



Now lay out all units as shown at left. Always using the same 1/4" seam allowance, sew three horizontal rows. Join the rows and your block is done!
