



April Refresher

- Half Square Triangle and Flying Geese Blocks
 - These two blocks are the most versital and are found within most blocks. Practicing and learning how to keep the points and make the right size is very valuable.
- Border Saw Tooth and Zig Zag
 - These two designs can be made to look very different when changing the fabric colors and sizes.
- Bonus Info Cornerstones
 - I find cornerstones can be used as a design element but can also be used to help finish a pieced border.

May block is Bear Paw or a Star block.

The border block is inserting a block into the border strip. Pieced border or floater border.

BOM - BLOCKS TO BORDERS



INSERT PIECED BLOCK


- Top Left Quilt:
 - A star block used partially around using the cornerstone to fit the border.
 - Inside there are rows of spiral squares that creates a border and appears as cornerstones.
- Bottom Right Quilt:
 - The star border around the panel pops with the white.
 - Notice there are three borders after the star borders to enlarge the quilt and showcase the stars around the panel.



Cornerstones






