

JULY 2023 BOM: INTERSECTION BLOCK

Fabric requirements

4 each 11" x11" squares of fabric in 4 different colors.

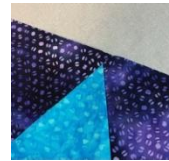
Method

Starch and iron your squares of fabric.

Fold each in half.

With a ruler, draw a diagonal line end to end (See photo) and cut.

Do this to all 4 squares.



Place 2 half triangles of a different color on each side of a triangle and sew together, $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams.

Make sure the tip of triangle has $\frac{1}{4}$ " overlap when attaching. Iron all seams flat.

Cut all 4 prepared squares into $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Start from the top of the triangle making sure to align your ruler at the edge of the $\frac{1}{4}$ " allowance above the top of the triangle.



Place each strip with the triangle in one color combination, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " apart with the tip of the triangle pointing in one direction and the other in the opposite direction.

Sew each strip together with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " allowance, starching and pressing each seam.

Left photo is using 2 of the 11"x11" blocks and the one on the right is with using all 4 blocks and attaching both pieced blocks together.

Finished size of each block is $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ ". Add $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips to the $9\frac{1}{2}$ " sides to make it a $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " square block for a square block if desired.
