



2024 HQG QUILT SHOW CHECKLIST

*Please use the checklist **BEFORE** completing the online entry form. One entry form per item. Limit of 2 entries per person but Challenge Quilt and Upcycle Projects do not count toward the limit.*

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL ENTRIES

	The online entry form MUST be submitted by midnight on Wednesday, April 17 . The deadline to submit finished quilts is the meeting on Monday, April 22.
	The quilt was sewn by an HQG member and not exhibited at a previous HQG quilt show.
	The quilt falls under ONE Quilt Show category: a) Challenge Quilt, b) Upcycle Project, c) Handmade / Hand Quilted, d) Pieced, e) Applique, f) Pictorial, e) Art. NOTE: <i>Descriptions of the categories – https://hawaiiquiltguild.dreamhosters.com/?page_id=7298</i>
	The majority of the quilt MUST have 3 distinct layers – a quilt top, middle layer, and backing. EXCEPTION: <i>Only Cathedral windows-style or Yo-Yo quilts or an upcycle project item does not need to have 3 layers.</i>
	The quilt MUST be quilted by either hand, machine, or tied. EXCEPTION: <i>Upcycle projects.</i>
	A quilt label with a minimum of your full name and, if possible, the quilt name is sewn or fused to the back of the quilt. For upcycle projects: The label with your full name is sewn somewhere on your project.
	The height (↓) and width (↔) of the finished quilt were obtained. If the quilt is not finished by the entry form deadline, use your best estimate. Accurate measurements will ensure the quilt will be properly displayed.
	The quilt MUST have a hanging sleeve sewn to the top back edge: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quilts 24” or smaller in width – May use triangle sleeves and provide a dowel if you have one. • Quilts between 60” and 100” wide – Split the quilt sleeve into 2 with a small gap in between. • Quilts 100” or wider – Split into 3 quilt sleeves.
	A description of 50 words or less has been written and contains details about the quilt or upcycle project, fabric choices, quilting techniques used, etc. NOTE: <i>The description will be printed on the tags displayed next to your quilt, therefore it is important to take the time to create a draft before completing the entry form.</i>

“40 SHADES OF RED” CHALLENGE QUILT ENTRIES

	40 shades of red fabric were used in the quilt.
	Red is the dominant color. Viewers would exclaim it is a RED quilt.
	Only ONE non-red color was used for the background yet the quilt is predominantly red.
	The quilt is a minimum of 24” x 24”. No maximum.

“UPCYCLE PROJECT” ENTRIES

	At least 75% of recycled materials were used.
	A BEFORE photo was taken of the items used in the project and is ready to be submitted with the project. <i>The photo is critical to show the transformation of the recycled material to the upcycled item.</i>
