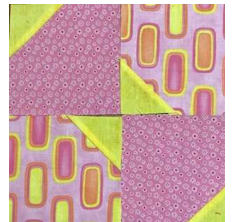
Traditional - Snowball Block

1. Cut one 9.5” square for your main block.
2. Cut four 2.5” squares for your corners in a different color from your main block. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the wrong side of the fabric for all four squares.
3. Place the smaller squares in each of the corners of your main block with right sides together. Make sure the drawn line is diagonal to the corner.
4. Stitch along the diagonal line for all 4 corners. Trim the excess fabric from each corner, leaving a ¼ “ seam allowance from the sewn line to the outer edge of the quilt block to form the corner triangles. Press the seams towards the smaller corner squares to form a snowball.



Modern Variation – Snowball Block

1. Cut four – 5” squares using fabric colors of your choice.
2. Cut four 2.5” squares in different colors from your 5” squares. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the wrong side of fabric for all four 2.5” squares.
3. Place the smaller square in one of the corners of one 5” square with right sides together. Make sure the drawn line is diagonal to the corner. Repeat this for the other 3 sets of squares.
4. Arrange the 4 blocks as you wish (try turning the blocks various ways) and sew into a 4-patch. Press and trim to 9 1/2” square.
